**Permanent Vote-by-Mail Non-Partisan Voters can Request
Democratic or Republican Crossover Ballots**

Sacramento County Registrar of Voters Jill LaVine announced today that beginning this week, Permanent Vote-by-Mail Non-Partisan voters will receive a postcard in the mail notifying them that they can vote their Non-Partisan ballot, or choose either a Democratic or Republican crossover ballot in the upcoming June 8, 2010 Statewide Direct Primary Election.

“The Democratic and Republican parties will allow Non-Partisan voters to crossover and request their party’s ballot,” says LaVine.

Permanent Vote-by-Mail Non-Partisan voters who choose to vote a crossover ballot need to sign and return the postcard as soon as possible to ensure that the Elections Office has enough time to mail out the requested ballot.

OTHER IMPORTANT DATES

The last day to register to vote for the June Statewide Primary is May 24, 2010.

Registration forms are available by calling (916) 875-6377 and requesting a Voter Registration Card be mailed to you. All completed registration forms must be mailed and postmarked by May 24, 2010 to be eligible to vote in the June 8, 2010 Statewide Direct Primary Election.
