Sacramento County Offers Vote-by-Mail Ballot Drop-off Sites for the November 2 General Election

Voters who do not want to mail their 2010 General Election Vote-by-Mail ballots may drop it off at any of seven locations throughout Sacramento County.

Sacramento County's downtown administration center and designated city clerk offices will serve as Vote-by-Mail ballot drop-off sites beginning Monday, October 25th through Friday, October 29th. You may also drop off your ballot at Sacramento County Elections office through 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

"We understand that it may be more convenient for some voters to drop their ballot off rather than mail it," says Registrar of Voters Jill LaVine. "We have partnered with our Clerk of the Board and local city clerks to provide additional drop-off locations within the community."

You can drop off your Vote-by-Mail ballot at one of these sites:

- Voter Registration and Elections Office, 7000 65th Street, Sacramento, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and until 8 p.m. on Election Day
- Any polling place in Sacramento County on Election Day, or

- Galt City Hall, 380 Civic Dr., Galt 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. M-Th
