### General Election Update

## October 22<sup>nd</sup> is Last Day to Register for Presidential Election

Registrar of Voters Jill LaVine reminds Sacramento County residents that the last day to register to vote for the upcoming Presidential Election is October 22, 2012. You can register online through the [Sacramento County Elections](http://www.saccounty.net/elections) website or pick-up a voter registration card at libraries, post offices or the Elections Office, 7000 65th Street, Suite A, Sacramento 95823.

Your completed registration form must be postmarked or received at least 15 days before the November 6<sup>th</sup> election.

### Note: Election Day Registration Not in Effect for this Election

Voters are reminded that Election Day voter registration will *not* be in effect for the November 6, 2012 election and are encouraged to submit their registration forms by October 22<sup>nd</sup>. Governor Brown signed into law AB1436 which allows anyone to register and vote on Election Day. However, this new law won't be operable until the Statewide Voter Registration Database 'Vote Cal' is deployed.

### Key Election Dates

**Oct 22** – Last day to register to vote in the November 6 General Election.

**Oct 30** – Last day to request a vote by mail ballot be mailed to you for the November 6 Election. Call (916) 875-6155 for information.

**Nov 6** – General Election. Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
